Dear Parents/Carers,

Re: Covid-19 outbreak management

We would like to inform you that there are a number of confirmed cases of Covid-19 at Beacon Hill Academy 9RSP.

Due to the number of cases in 9RSP, Dudley Council Public Health are advising your child arranges a PCR test, even if they do not have symptoms. This is to help identify any further transmission. **Please note if your child has tested positive within the last 90 days do not get them tested, unless they have a new onset of symptoms.** Your child will not be required to isolate, whilst waiting for their results, unless they are displaying symptoms. However, they are encouraged to undertake daily Lateral Flow Tests whilst waiting for their PCR test result, and:

- If the result is positive, they should isolate for 10 full days, in line with the [guidance](#).
- If the result is negative, they can remain in school and are encouraged to continue to undertake daily Lateral Flow Tests for 7 days after the date of the PCR test. For information on how to access lateral flow test kits visit www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests

These additional measures are to help identify any further transmission.

To book a PCR test visit <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test> and tick “I’ve been told to get a test by my local council, health protection team or healthcare professional” or call 119. Full guidance on how to book a PCR test online if you don’t not have symptoms is attached to this letter.

Furthermore, households of nursery, school and college aged children are strongly encouraged to take part in twice-weekly lateral flow testing. This is because 1 in 3 people have coronavirus without displaying symptoms. If all families participate, it gives us the best chance of keeping our academy safe and avoiding further transmission. How to book a PCR test online if you do not have symptoms

1. Visit this website: <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test> and choose 'Start now' near the bottom of the page
2. Select: "No" the person is not an essential worker

Is the person who needs a test an essential worker?

Essential workers include NHS staff, teachers and transport staff. Check the [full list of essential workers on GOV.UK](#).

Test sites
