Having joined as a newly qualified teacher and worked here for 20 years, I know how special this academy is. Now, as the Principal, I am delighted that in a recent Ofsted inspection, Beacon Hill Academy received a 'good' rating in all areas. The report praised the school for being a place "where everyone goes the extra mile for their pupils".

For several years our GCSE results have shown improvements, with the academy securing above national progress in 2023. The marked rise in the proportion of learners achieving Grade 5 or higher in both English and Mathematics is a very good indicator of the advances made across the academy. We have the skills, experience and dynamism in the team at Beacon Hill to ensure that the academy continues to go from strength to strength.

We want learners to enjoy their time here, to feel safe, to feel supported and to make excellent progress as a result. Both my staff and I passionately believe that every young person matters. Every learner has a wide array of talents, which we will identify, nurture and promote. As a large school, we have a strength and depth of teaching staff and extensive learner support services. We also have an emphasis on rewarding effort and achievement, with weekly and termly celebrations of our learners' accomplishments.

Over the past five years, we have invested a significant sum of money into brand new computers and networking. Recently, we received the exciting news that we have been awarded funding to rebuild the academy with new buildings and new facilities, and we expect that project to commence in the near future.

The large number of GCSE subjects that we offer means that every learner will find something that genuinely interests them. Learners are also able to participate in many additional activities including engineering, art, science, dance, the Duke of Edinburgh scheme and a variety of sports. The academy offers a rounded education that will open young people's eyes to the opportunities available in the wider world if they study hard and give themselves something to aim for.

I am delighted that you have taken the time to consider Beacon Hill Academy for your child. You are welcome to visit our academy during our Open Evening or during the school day. I look forward to meeting you in the near future.

We have introduced a proven system of rewards and behaviour management that has changed the culture of our classrooms, accompanied by a raft of new approaches to teaching. About our sponsor

The Trust's sponsor, Dudley College of Technology, is one of the most successful further education Colleges in the UK and a major contributor to the development of the economy in The Black Country and beyond. The transformational leadership that has propelled the development of the College is a driving force behind Dudley Academies Trust.

The College provides education and training programmes across the West Midlands, enrolling some 12,000 learners each year on approximately 4,000 academic and vocational programmes, including A Levels, T Levels, skills-based courses and apprenticeships.

Ofsted rated as 'good' in its most recent inspection, the College has success rates for learners across all programmes that are on or significantly above national benchmarks. A very high proportion of Trust learners go on to benefit from the College's high-quality education, inspiring facilities and access to world-leading technology.

On the College's technical and vocational programmes, over 95 per cent of 16-18 year-old full-time learners move on to higher/further education or employment. Of those who study A levels at Dudley Sixth, 80 per cent choose to continue to university, with many more moving on to the College's own higher education courses.

Specialist centres at the College are equipped to provide a technical education unsurpassed in the region; they include Dudley Advance I, a state-of-the-art Centre for Advanced Manufacturing and Engineering & Technology, and Dudley Advance II, a Centre for Advanced Building Technologies.

Every year, the College supports thousands of apprentices, a very high percentage of whom progress to higher apprenticeships and degree level programmes.

Dudley College is the lead Further Education institution in the Black Country and Marches Institute of Technology (IoT), a major new development based at the heart of the Black Country. The IoT offers a wide range of high-quality technical education programmes with clear pathways to skilled jobs in Advanced Engineering & Manufacturing, Modern Methods of Construction and Medical Engineering & Healthcare.

In February 2020, the college was awarded the Queen's Anniversary Prize for Higher and Further Education in recognition of its contribution to the economy of the West Midlands through large-scale advanced vocational and technical education. Its Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Assured (STEM) @ status is also recognition that they are delivering high-quality education and training in all of these areas.

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Settling in and getting set up for life

Transition

We ensure that the transition from primary to secondary school is as smooth as possible and an exciting and happy experience for your child.

During May and June, we will contact your child's primary school to learn all about their academic progress so far. Our staff then go out to all of our main feeder schools to say 'hello' to the learners, talk to their teachers and learn all about them and their abilities and needs. Any extra support that is needed will be noted so that it can be in place when your child comes to us. SEND staff will also make contact where appropriate.

Then, in July, all new learners will come to taster days, when they will attend lessons, make new friends, get to know their teachers, get used to the behaviour and rewards system, and begin to feel at home in the academy. There will also be a meeting for all new parents and carers which you are strongly encouraged to attend.

Pastoral support is one of our strengths. Every learner who joins us will clearly know who to talk to if they have things on their mind. That support is with them throughout their school career.

We place a lot of emphasis on Collaborative Learning. Learners will usually be seated in groups rather than rows, and ideas, thoughts and opinions will be discussed in a structured way followed across all lessons. This ensures that learning is active and thought-provoking. It also ensures that all learners are engaged in the learning process and not just a few who might be asked questions by the teacher.

The impact of collaborative approaches on learning is consistently positive. Learners sit in mixed-ability groups of four and work together to solve problems and work out answers. Effective Collaborative Learning requires much more than just sitting pupils together and asking them to work in a group; the lesson is carefully structured by the teacher, with well-designed tasks that lead to the greatest learning gains. Approaches which promote talk and interaction between learners are particularly important. Learners gain hugely from the other children who work with them, as well as from the teacher, who is constantly involved.

Collaborative Learning is just one of the factors that contributes to our emphasis on communication skills. In the classrooms, the learners have to constantly communicate with each other and the teacher; we ensure that there are many other communication challenges to develop their abilities, from poetry recitals to student leadership and mentoring roles at every level of the academy.



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Helping your child to succeed

In Year 10, learners progress to study GCSE courses. They study the core subjects, English, Mathematics, Science and PE, plus others that they choose themselves. Our learners are supported by our highly-committed teachers who are themselves supported by subject directors and coaches from the Trust Central Team.

We aim to accelerate the progress of every single learner by:

- Building on areas of strength to improve outcomes for all learners.
- Quickly identifying and dealing with any areas of weakness.
- Accelerating learner attainment.
- Increasing the levels of outstanding teaching in the academy.
- Raising learner confidence, developing their future career aspirations and increasing their knowledge of career options.
- Ensuring that all learners, irrespective of their differing abilities, achieve their maximum potential.

We have a strong emphasis on English and Mathematics skills as the foundation for academic success, and we have introduced exciting new ways of teaching these critical subjects. These teaching methods are focused on encouraging communication, getting every learner in a classroom to join in with the lesson and helping the learners to solve problems in teams and to learn from each other. The key to success is making learners want to

learn, giving them goals that motivate them 'Dreaming big' and approaches to teaching that keep them engaged, focused and making progress in every subject 'Learning that inspires'.

One area where the Trust has invested is in state-of-the art learning technologies which we use for Mathematics, English and a range of other subjects. These software programmes can be used at school or in the home.

Parents and Carers often think that the performance of their children is only reviewed once a term when Parents' Evenings are held. At all of the secondary academies within Dudley Academies Trust, the performance of each learner is recorded and actively monitored on a week-by-week basis. We know almost immediately which learners might need more support and which ones can be pushed on to a higher level of achievement. This is regularly reviewed and discussed by the Senior Leadership Team; every child is known, understood and helped to be the best that they can be.

Upgrade is an initiative that supports our Year 11 learners and prepares them for their GCSE exams. An extended school day gives learners the best chance of performing to the best of their ability. There are practice papers throughout the year, extra revision lessons, study skills kits and a wide range of rewards to ensure that everyone stays focused on their goals. All learners are encouraged to 'Dream big' and aim for the highest grades.



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Confident and Caring Citizens

We want our learners to leave us after five years with great qualifications and a good idea of what careers they might progress to. We also want to give them the confidence to succeed in the world and the attitudes and behaviours to make positive contributions to our society.

In order to achieve this, we run a wide range of programmes focusing on careers, leadership, volunteering, personal and social responsibility, confidence building and personal development. The following pages tell you about these in greater detail. All of them are underpinned by our system of behaviours and rewards.

Values Driven Expectations

Every school has a behaviour model, but ours is different. It focuses on opportunities for learners to be rewarded of course, there are sanctions for learners who break the rules. Values Driven Expectations cuts out the behaviour that stops learners from learning, that wastes time in the classroom and distracts attention from the subject being studied. In and out of the classroom, learners and teachers tell us that our behaviour model is a massive plus point for our academies.

Our emphasis is on rewarding good behaviour, attendance and punctuality, thoughtfulness and kindness, effort, achievement, participation in academy life and setting a good example.

All adults in school actively seek opportunities to praise and to hand out merit stamps and commendations. Learners who earn a certain number of merits and commendations are rewarded at special celebration events throughout the academic year.

Our values

Our five core values are at the heart of all that we do. Our values were shaped by the student leaders from each of the academies and reflect the kind of ethos and culture they want to be a part of.

Our values are shared among all of the Trust's members and give us a shared understanding of how we should all behave so that we can all be happy and successful. At all times we should treat each other with respect.

Commitments

Commitments is a fantastic programme that brings our values to life. It challenges learners to display our values in their behaviour, to think about their futures, to participate in student leadership and to get involved in all sorts of extracurricular activities. There are rewards for learners who achieve the commitments that they make, but the real reward is that our young people grow in their attitudes, abilities and responsibilities.

All learners in every year group have the opportunity to participate in student leadership activities, at the heart of which is our Student Leadership team. This highly impressive group of young people supports key school events across the Trust and works with the entire student body to ensure that our core values are put into practice. Members of this team regularly report to our Principals' Board, the Local Advisory Committees and our Trust Board.

Our young leaders genuinely play a central role in shaping the direction of the Trust and putting learner voice at the heart of our decision-making processes.

In the academies, young leaders help to organise school events, guide people on tours, speak in assemblies, work on 'staying safe' initiatives, discuss issues and suggestions with the Principal, organise sports teams, run charity events and contribute to the recruitment of staff.



Supporting our young people and their families

Our Trust is more than a Trust and we are more than a school. This means that we go the extra mile in supporting our young people and their families.

Any new Year 7 learner that joins our school is gifted with a free blazer and tie. We also provide a free tie for our Year 11 learners and a free tie for our Student Leaders.

We are proud to be part of Dudley Academies Trust, a Multi Academies Trust (MAT) in the heart of Dudley which is made up of two primary schools and four secondary schools. All academies within our Trust provide free uniform items for children who join our family of schools.

Learning that inspires

As part of Dudley Academies Trust, we can offer a very wide range of sporting and extra-curricular activities.

Recently, our learners have participated in public speaking and poetry recitation competitions, full-scale dramas, musicals, dance, STEM competitions, entrepreneurship competitions, business networking, public debates, foreign trips, field trips, charity events, community activities and many other interesting and worthwhile additions to their studies.

Poetry by Heart

Poetry by Heart, an initiative supported by the Department for Education, is another confidence-building challenge based around speaking skills. Learners get used to memorising and reciting poems in front of a range of different audiences

and compete with each other to enter a national poetry reciting competition. Learners from our schools have reached regional and national finals, with the national finalists having performed in front of famous poets at the Globe Theatre.

A Mind to be Kind

The 'Mind to be Kind' programme develops a culture where kindness, without an expectation of reward, becomes a way of life. Rather than focusing on performing acts of kindness for a reward, we focus on how it feels when we are kind. The aim is that giving and receiving kindness becomes natural and normal. This programme is central to ensuring that our academies are safe, happy and calm places where everyone is respected.

The 'Mind to be Kind' programme is delivered to all learners as a series of short 'Stop and Think' sessions where kindness is explored through three main themes:

- Acts of Kindness
- Living without Harming Others
- Respect.

- Workplace visits, work shadowing and work experience with leading businesses such as Thomas Dudley.
- Taking part in business events and entering entrepreneurial competitions.
- Outside speakers from business and industry.
- Interview practice with experienced interviewers.
- Taster courses at Dudley College of Technology in their industry-standard studios, salons, IT suites and advanced engineering and building technology facilities.
- Visits to top universities.

By the end of Year 11, our learners will be equipped to understand and take advantage of the opportunities ahead of them. Whether they choose A Levels or college courses and apprenticeships, learners will leave us with a map of where they want to go in life and a passport of knowledge and experience that will help them to get there.

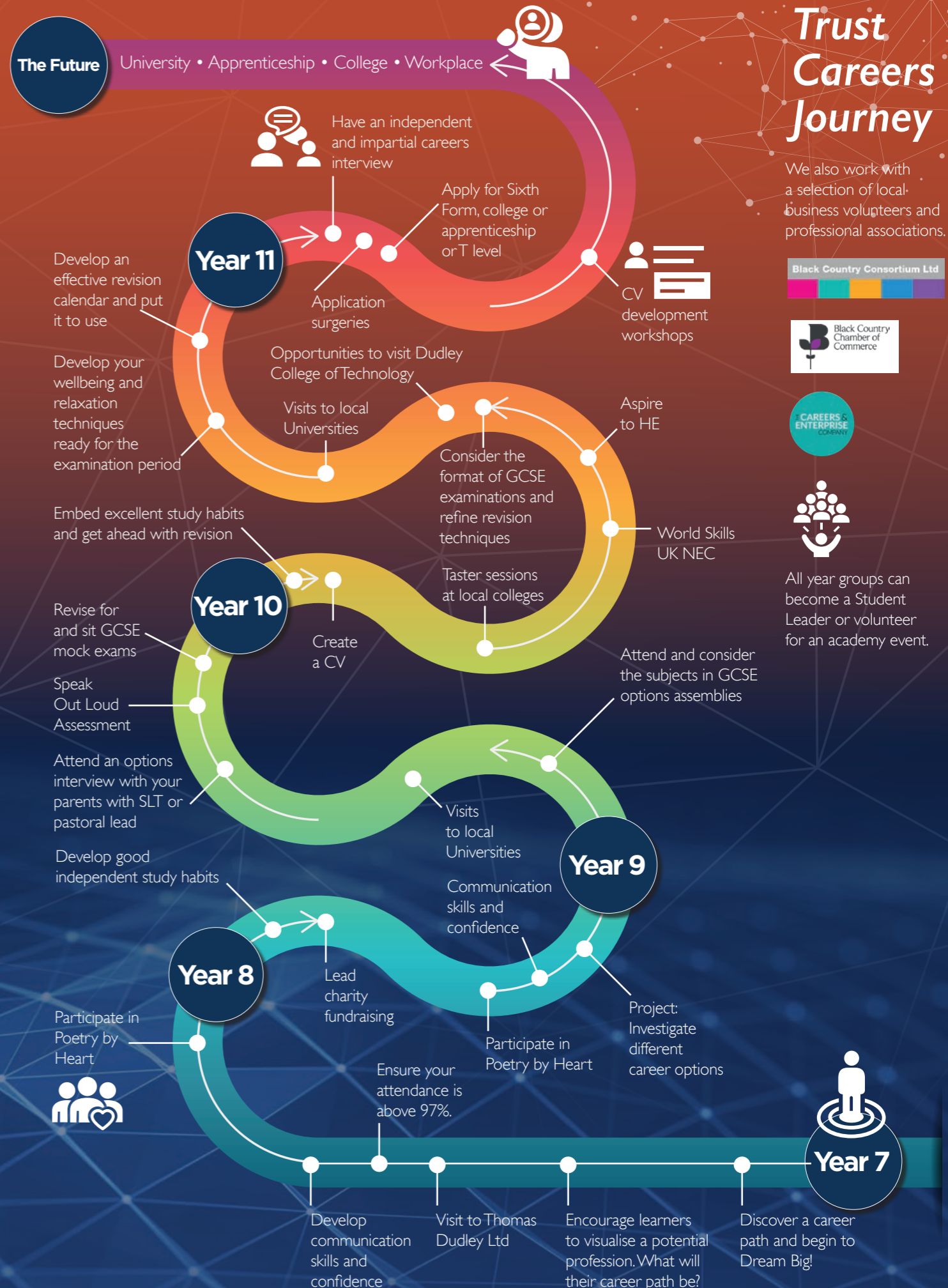
