Dear Parents / Carers,

Uniform Expectations – Summer Term

As we approach the end of the term, I wanted to take the opportunity to communicate and re-enforce our uniform expectations.

We ask for your continued support in ensuring uniform expectations are upheld:

- During the winter months, we would encourage all learners to arrive to school in an **outdoor coat**. Please note that **hoodies (including zip hoodies), denim jackets and tracksuits tops** are not permitted to be worn on the school grounds. Please reiterate to your child that **coats must be removed before entering the school building and shirts must be tucked in**.
- If your child decides to wear a black jumper for extra warmth, this must be a **plain black V neck jumper**, with no additional branding or patterns.
- Learners who choose to wear a skirt must ensure it is not made from stretchy material, and it must be at least knee length when walking. This supports a smart, consistent appearance and aligns with our uniform expectations
- Learners are to wear formal, smart, black leather or patent shoes. **Learners are not permitted to wear trainers or other canvas footwear. Any learners wearing these will be given a detention**, and will be asked to change into school shoes. Please see the parent/carer guide ([download.asp](#)) for further guidance on uniform expectations.
- In addition to the uniform expectations outlined above, we have noticed an increase in learners wearing star-shaped stickers to cover spots (Hydro-Stars). **We ask that learners refrain from using these stickers, as they are not part of the school uniform** and can undermine the professional and consistent appearance we expect. Hydro-Stars are most effectively used overnight.
- Jewellery is restricted to one small plain metal stud in each ear lobe. No facial piercings, such as nose studs, or stretcher-style piercings are allowed. **Please note that when we return from Easter any learners caught wearing Jewellery that does not adhere to the school policy will be issued with a detention.**

- Fake eyelashes and nail extensions are **not permitted, again any learners caught wearing these, will be issued with a detention.**
- Hair accessories such as bows, flowers and wide bands are **not permitted**, thin 'Alice bands' may be worn. Only natural hair dyes are permitted - this also includes hair extensions or braids. Hair should be no shorter than grade 1 and **no design lines/patterns are allowed.**

To support your child's attendance to school, we would like to remind you that we offer a **free breakfast to all learners from 8am**. This is served from the canteen area. Just a reminder, we expect learners to be on site by 8.30am, allowing them to be at their form tutor's room by 8.40am each day.
